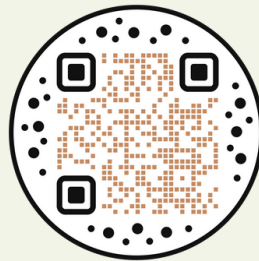


#### **APHASIA TOOLKIT**
